

NON-UNIFORM DAY – Friday 10th February will be Non-uniform day. With World Book Day approaching, we are looking to organise some lovely activities with the children and will be using donations from the non-uniform day towards this. Please can children either bring £1 to school on this day or make a donation on ParentPay.



WORLD BOOK DAY - Thursday 2nd March is World Book Day. On this day children are encouraged to dress up as their favourite book character. Children will also be bringing home a £1 book token in preparation for World Book Day. Please use this in participating shops to purchase one of the applicable books. On World Book Day we will be holding a 'Swaparama' where the children will rotate around the classes to enjoy a full day of activities led by staff based on children's literature.

AUTHOR VISIT – On 16th March we will have a wonderful visit from Author Dan Worsley. He will be doing a whole school assembly followed by storytelling in EYFS/ KS1 then writing workshops in KS2.

LIBRARY BUS – The library bus won't be returning until Tuesday 28th March. All books that have been taken this time will be renewed but if you would like to return them to school earlier please bring them to the office and I will store them until then.

BOOK COVER COMPETITION – Our charity rep Eesha in Year 6 is running a competition over the next week to design and create a book cover. This can be an existing book or they can make up their own, children brought home the competition sheets this week. There will be prizes for the winners. To enter, your child will need to bring their sheet into school with 50p entry fee **before Thursday 9th February**. Any money raised will be used to purchase much needed items for The Foxton homeless centre from their wish list.

SPELLING STRATEGY OF THE WEEK: Each week we highlight a new spelling strategy for you to use to support your child in learning their spellings. These spellings could be the ones sent home by your class teacher or words that your child knows they struggle to spell when writing independently. Little and often is the way to go - 5 or 10 mins per day is far better than 40 mins in one go!

Rainbow Writing: This is particularly useful for learning to spell new spellings. On a piece of plain paper, write the word in the middle in black pen. Then give your child various colours of felt tip or crayon. Your child then writes over the original word in each of the colours to create a rainbow of the word. This builds muscle memory for how to form the letters and write the word without the need for sounding it out.



Can you think of a better word? Each week we will give you a word and your child's challenge will be to find as many words as they can that mean the same thing. We are looking for adventurous vocabulary. They could find them in the book they are reading, in discussion with other people or in a thesaurus. Please get them to write the words down and bring them in to

school to give to their teacher. Can you think any better words for **sad**?
