

**SPELLING STRATEGY OF THE WEEK**: Each week we highlight a new spelling strategy for you to use to support your child in learning their spellings. These spellings could be the ones sent home by your class teacher or words that your child knows they struggle to spell when writing independently. Little and often is the way to go - 5 or 10 mins per day is far better than 40 mins in one go!

**Stair writing**: For this spelling strategy you will need a plain piece of paper for each word and a pen. First write the word for your child to practise spelling on a smaller piece of paper. Your child looks at the word and studies it for a minute, trying to remember as many of the letters as they can. They then cover the word card and write only the first letter of the word. Check this against the original word card. Then cover the word card again and, underneath the initial letter, write the first two letters of the word. Check against the word card. Then cover the first three letters. Check again. Repeat this process, adding one letter at a time, until the whole word is written. It will look like a set of stairs going down the page





Can you think of a better word? Each week we will give you a word and your child's challenge will be to find as many words as they can that mean the same thing. We are looking for adventurous vocabulary. They could find them in the book they are reading, in discussion with other people or in a thesaurus. Please get them to write the words down and bring them in to school to give to their teacher. Can you

think any better words for happy?
