NUTS AND GRAPES - This is a reminder that children should not bring any nuts and grapes in to school and if your child is bringing cherry tomatoes, then these must be cut in half lengthways as they are a choking hazard.

BIRTHDAYS - A reminder that children may wear non-uniform on their birthday (or the nearest day to it). This enables everyone in school to make a fuss of them on their big day! We also know children love to bring in treats for their class on their birthday and we will be able to allow this again this year however, we must insist that treats are small and individually wrapped (no birthday cake). Children can then take this home and it is the parent's decision if and when they have this.

AFTER SCHOOL CARE – A reminder that after school activities cannot be relied upon for childcare. These clubs are often run by staff or volunteers and are sometimes cancelled at short-notice. If you know that you will require childcare after school, you should contact Mrs Greenhalgh in Stay and Play Club (Tel 01772 864953) to secure a place. The after school club list will be issued next week and places can be booked on ParentPay.

HARVEST FESTIVAL - A traditional Harvest Festival in St Lawrence Church on Sunday 22nd September, 10:00 to 10:50. This year children in Years 1 and 2 will take part in the service with a short presentation and prayers. The whole school is welcome to attend the service and to bring gifts of tins or packets of food. The Rose Queen, Hannah and her retinue will be in attendance and will help to receive gifts of food items from the children as they present them at the front of church. The food is then taken to the local food bank.

HARVEST GIFTS - Children who are unable to attend the Harvest Service are welcome to bring their harvest gifts to school on Friday 20th September. Classes will be able to visit church during the afternoon to present their gifts.

COMMUNICATION WITH SCHOOL - Just a little reminder about our communication policy.

Teachers may not be available for a quick word before school; our policy of children making their way to the classrooms independently at the start of the day means that staff are already busy with pupils in class. If you need to pass on a message in the morning, please speak to (or email) Louise in the school office, a member of staff on duty or write a brief note for your child to hand to the class teacher. Alternatively speak to the teacher when they bring their class to the playground at the end of the day. We understand that talking at length at the classroom door or in the playground is sometimes difficult so if you need to talk to your child's class teacher in more detail or in private, please make an appointment with them through the school office. All contact from class teachers to parents will be made in person at the end of the school day, through the weekly newsletter or via School Spider. Please make sure you have downloaded the School Spider app. Staff in EYFS and Year 1 will continue to use Dojo to share children's learning journeys with parents. Dojo should not be used for any other means.

SCHOOL SPIDER APP -In order to receive communications from us, you must download the app and **stay logged in**. You must also accept push notifications in order to be notified when you receive a new communication. Your username is your first name and surname with no spaces e.g louisehigham. When logging on for the first time please click Forgotten password or follow the link on the



separate email sent to you. Please note where we have two parents/carers details each person will be allocated their own login details. Please do not struggle with this, just pop in to see Louise in the office!

ONE HUNDRED CLUB - **Please help us!** As a church school, the governors have to fund 10% of the cost of any maintenance or building projects. We also have to pay VAT.
