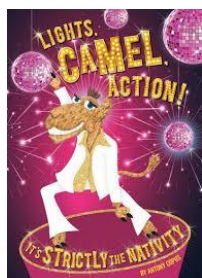

PARKING - Please can we remind you all to consider everyone's safety when parking at school.
