David used and learnt form his own experience <i>1 Samuel 17 verses 34 to 37</i> 	 The Syro-phoencian Woman – a woman comes to Jesus and asks for help for her daughter and initially Jesus says no because she is not a Jew – but she has the confidence to ask again <i>Mark 7 verses 24-30</i> Mary the mother of Jesus who said yes when the angel came to tell her she was to be the mother of Jesus and she sings a song of praise (the Magnificat) <i>Luke 1 verses 46 to 56</i> Confident even though this was not an acceptable situation in terms of her being unmarried Confident that God's love and care would be enough for all the challenges she would have to face
